Collect

Almighty and everlasting God, increase in us your gift of faith that, forsaking what lies behind and reaching out to that which is before, we may run the way of your commandments and win the crown of everlasting joy; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Gospel

Luke 18:1-8

Jesus told disciples a parable about their need to pray always and not to lose heart. He said, 'In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor had respect for people. In that city there was a widow who kept coming to him and saying, "Grant me justice against my opponent." For a while he refused; but later he said to himself, "Though I have no fear of God and no respect for anyone, yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will grant her justice, so that she may not wear me out by continually coming." ' And the Lord said, 'Listen to what the unjust judge says. And will not God grant justice to his chosen ones who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long in helping them? I tell you, he will quickly grant justice to them. And yet, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?'

Cathedral Foodbank collection takes place next Sunday 27 October at the 1000 Choral Eucharist. Food shortages are: Urgent: Meat tins, Potatoes tins/ instant, Custard Tins/ cartons. Top Priority: Sponge puddings, Milk 1L semi-skimmed, Fruit Juice 1L, Rice, Pasta Sauce, Soup tins/pkts, Noodle/Pasta snacks, Fruit tins, Rice Pudding tins, Biscuits, Jams & Spreads, Squash/Cordial. Medium Priority: Fish tins, Vegetables tins, Sugar gran. Cereals, small/ medium, Toiletries. Anything in-date, nutritious and non perishable welcome.

Outward Giving: The Cathedral Community's Special Appeal for Harvest-tide is for the Exeter Foodbank. During October at the Sunday services only, there will be special collection plates for donations of money to the Foodbank at the West End of the Cathedral and on the Cathedral Community Table in the South Transept. Please give generously. In addition, on Sunday 27 October, the day of Harvest Festival, we will have our usual collection of food for the Foodbank. Even if you do not usually support the Foodbank, please bring an offering on that day. The items that are particularly needed are: High Priority: Tins of meat, Sponge Puddings, Milk – 1L UHT semi-skimmed, Potatoes – tins/ instant Vegetables – tins (eg sweetcorn/peas/carrots), Fruit – tins, Rice Pudding – tins, Custard – tins/cartons, Biscuits, Noodle/Pasta Snacks, Jams & Spreads, Squash /Cordial PRIORITY (less than 12 weeks stock) Medium Priority: Fruit Juice – 1L long-life, Rice – 500g/1kg, Fish – tins (tuna), Pasta Sauce, Coffee – instant, Sugar (granulated), Soup - tins/packets, Cereals – small/ medium size packs Toiletries – Shower gel/Shampoo, Deodorant, Tooth-brush/paste
