Face Coverings in the cathedral

As of 8 August 2020, wearing face coverings in places of worship is now mandatory. All members of the congregation at all services, visitors, volunteers, and staff music wear face coverings when in the cathedral. Other than when officiating at worship or preaching – when clergy are far from other people and their voices need to be heard – clergy will be adhering to this requirement. There area exemptions to this regulation including anyone under the age of 11, or those with disabilities, or hidden health conditions. Full details can be fund here:
