# What's on for schools at the Cathedral in 2018/19

Spend the day with us in Exeter by splitting your visit between Exeter Cathedral and St Nicholas Priory

Pupils walk the 10 mins from Cathedral Green to St Nicholas Priory where they can don a Tudor cloak ready for their tour. They can learn the building's history as they are taken through the medieval monks' cellar, into the parlour, the bedroom and The Great Hall - all decorated in the glorious Tudor style. As part of your local history project, you could discover more about: the rich merchant who lived there with his family, the Tudor



games children played, how the kitchen was used, or maybe design bespoke wall panelling to suit the new owners.

[Total approx. 1.5 hours, 10.30-12.00. Have your packed lunch in the Great Hall]



After lunch, take a tour around Exeter Cathedral on a curriculum linked theme of your choice with one of our knowledgeable guides and finish with a brass rubbing session, taking a piece of history home with you.

[Total approx. 1.5 hours, 13.00-14.30]

Class groups of 30 are split into 2 smaller groups. Up to 60 pupils per day on this tour package. The cost per pupil is £6 for the day visit.





Discover the Cathedral and other unique spaces around Cathedral Green.

Students will be offered a range of activities on a round-robin basis. Experiences include a Cathedral tour, craft activity, the Cathedral's ancient Library and Archive, and a chance to visit the Devon and Exeter Institution (on Cathedral Green). Please see web for subject links. It is a great day for allowing us to link to your preferred focus and to see these buildings and spaces, which are often inaccessible to school groups. # Art and Local History Week 5th-23rd May 2019



### Join us at Exeter Cathedral for an historical themed tour and related art and craft activity.

Choose from brass rubbing, heraldry design, stained glass creations on a miniscale, architectural drawing exercises or clay gargoyles. Each activity has relevant links for those hoping to cover local history themes. **Cost £5 per student for the day.** 





## Science Week: 8th-19th March 2019 The theme for our extend week is "Journeys"

#### All activities £3 per pupil, per session

**Inky Quills** – Make plant based medieval ink and write about a journey inspired by one of our precious library books by William Dampier and the documentation of his new voyage round the world.

**Mock Poo Excavation** - What can the archaeologist in you discover by studying poo samples left by people from different times in history? Exploration will help you discover facts about life style and habits and social standing—get stuck in! Also, find out what happened when the Cathedral Green became the site of a dig back in the 1970's.

**Shrinkie Plastic Designs** - Understand the science of changing molecules when heating and cooling plastic. Design images based on strange and wonderful animals that are depicted in our library collection and watch them shrink into a palm sized masterpieces to take home.

**Building a Cathedral** – Explore how the main body of the Cathedral was built during the Medieval period, with the use of our mini working models and engage with building tasks set by our stone masons. The Cathedral Fabric Roles informs us about the journey of all the materials that make up the Cathedral as we see it today. What did a cat get paid for?

**The Story of Flight** – Make and fly several different types of flying craft. Can a plane fly with a circular wing? Discover the links to flying in the Cathedral building and fly your creations across the Cathedral Nave.

Just like a Pilgrim, the transition from primary to secondary school is an important time, highlighting a milestone in a forward journey.



#### Murder in the Medieval Cathedral 3rd & 5th October 2018 / 6th & 7th February 2019



Cathedrals were of huge importance to medieval society, where religion dominated the lives of all - be they rich or peasants.

By exploring the Cathedral, pupils will gain an insight into the society, economy and culture of the Medieval world. This is a Murder Mystery tour, where students will be called upon to question various 13th century characters in order to make reasoned judgements. They will take part in a role-play of the Precentor's murder in 1283. Students will hear the story behind the murder then set off to find the characters that played a part in the story and decide which punishment befits the crime. £4 per pupil. Join us for a morning (10.00-12.00) or afternoon (13.00-15.00) session.
