Dr. Alison Perham is a retired physician, initially working in General Practice, before specialising in Palliative Medicine. She has worked in different settings, hospitals, hospices and the community, in different parts of the country as her husband's job moved.

Having seen the benefit of informed decision-making it has made her value opportunities where those discussions can be gently approached.

Her intention during the conversation is not to set herself up as an expert, but as someone who has been privileged to have witnessed, perhaps more than some, the complexities surrounding the end of our lives.
